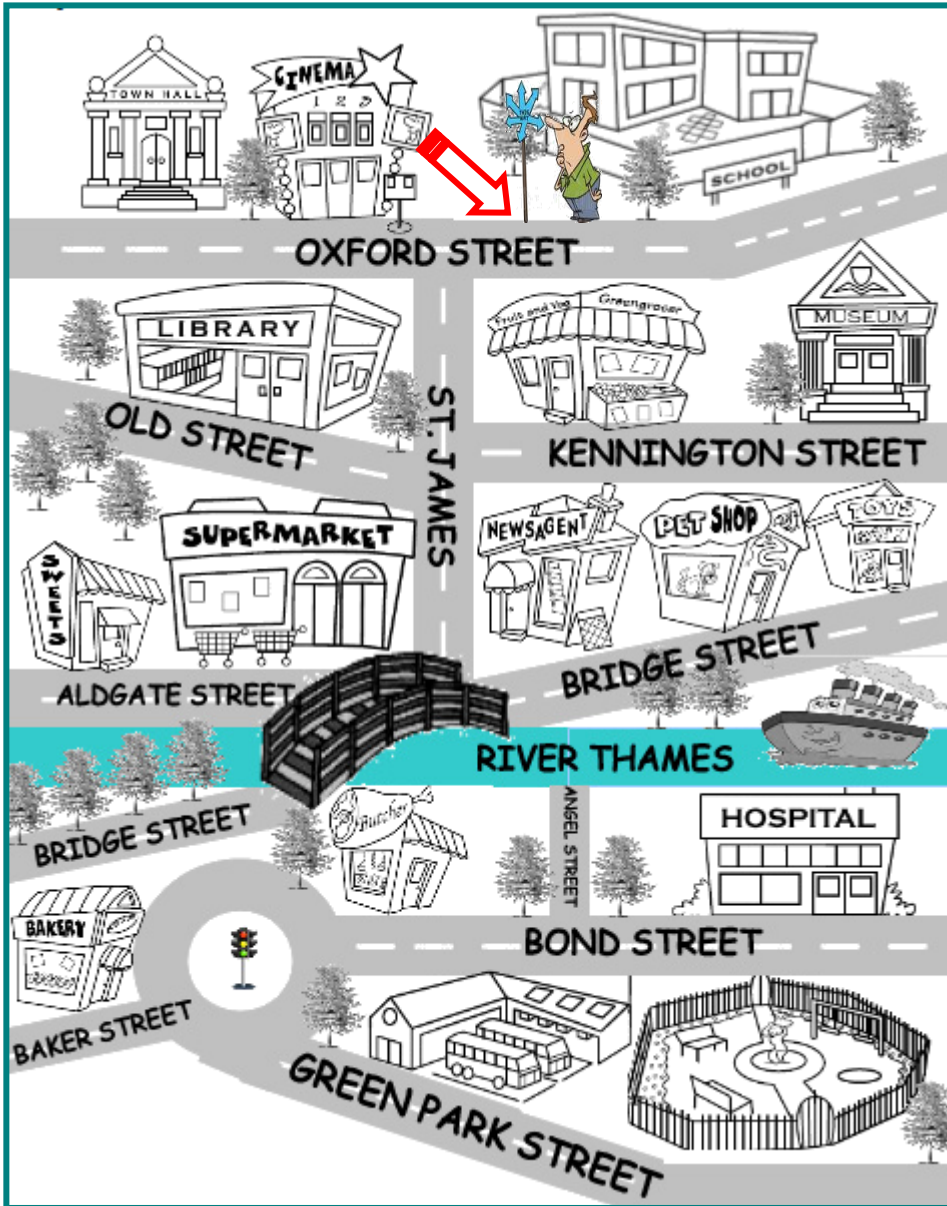

Giving Directions
